Survey Details

Each secondary school Reopen Community Corps administered their own survey. Central Office provided an optional template that could be customized for their school context, and schools administered the survey to parents and students. The survey was voluntary, and all survey questions were optional.

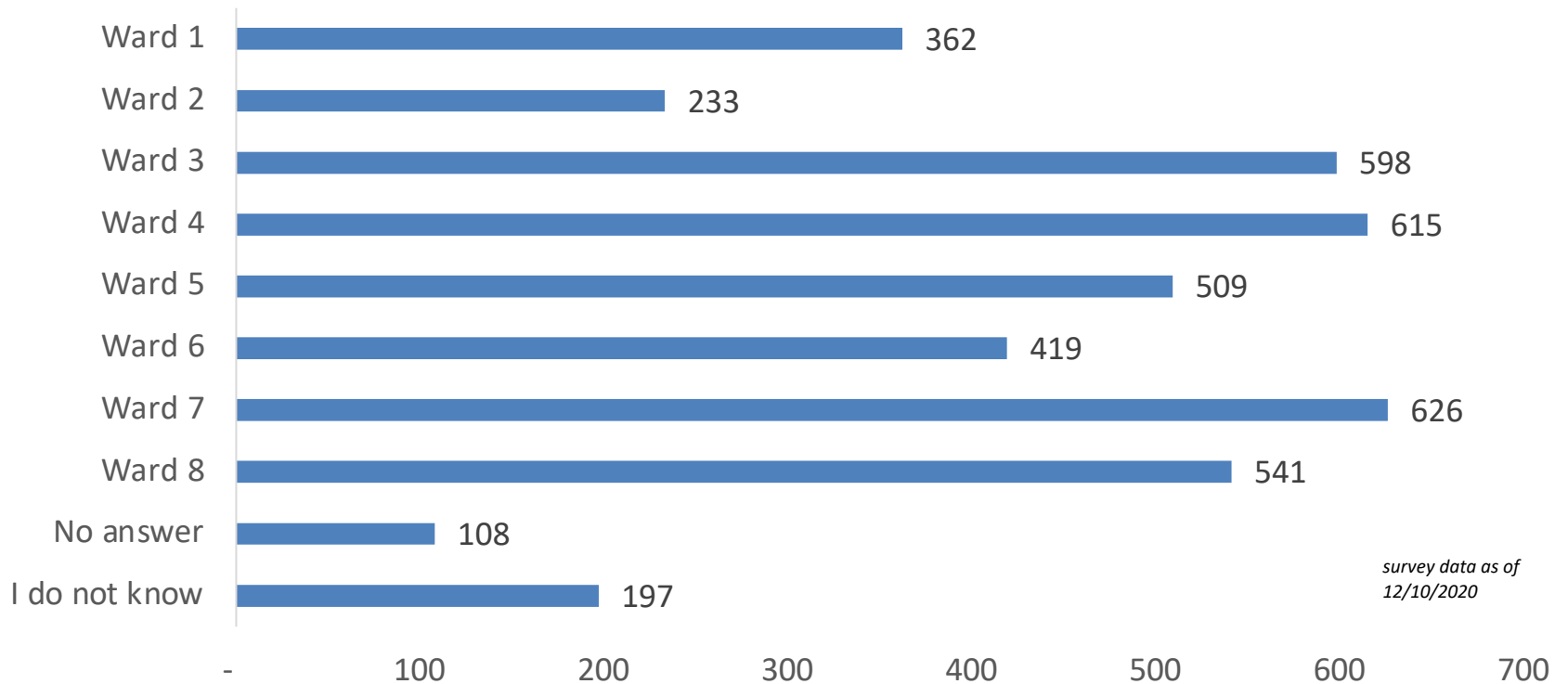
- These results represent responses from 21 school communities from 6 standardized questions.
- Survey window: December 1 – December 9.

Survey Questions

- 5 demographic questions:
 - Are you the parent of a secondary student, or are you a secondary student?
 - Which DCPS school does your child/do you currently attend?
 - What grade is your child/are you currently enrolled in?
 - Does your child/do you have Individualized Education Program (IEP) accommodations in place?
 - What ward does your child/do you live in?
- 1 content question:
 - Do you want to participate in an in-person learning experience or do you prefer to remain all virtual?
 - In-Person Learning experience
 - All virtual
- One open-ended question:
 - To help your Reopen Community Corps inform decisions about your school reopening, what additional information would you like your school to consider? dcpsreopenstrong.com/community-corps

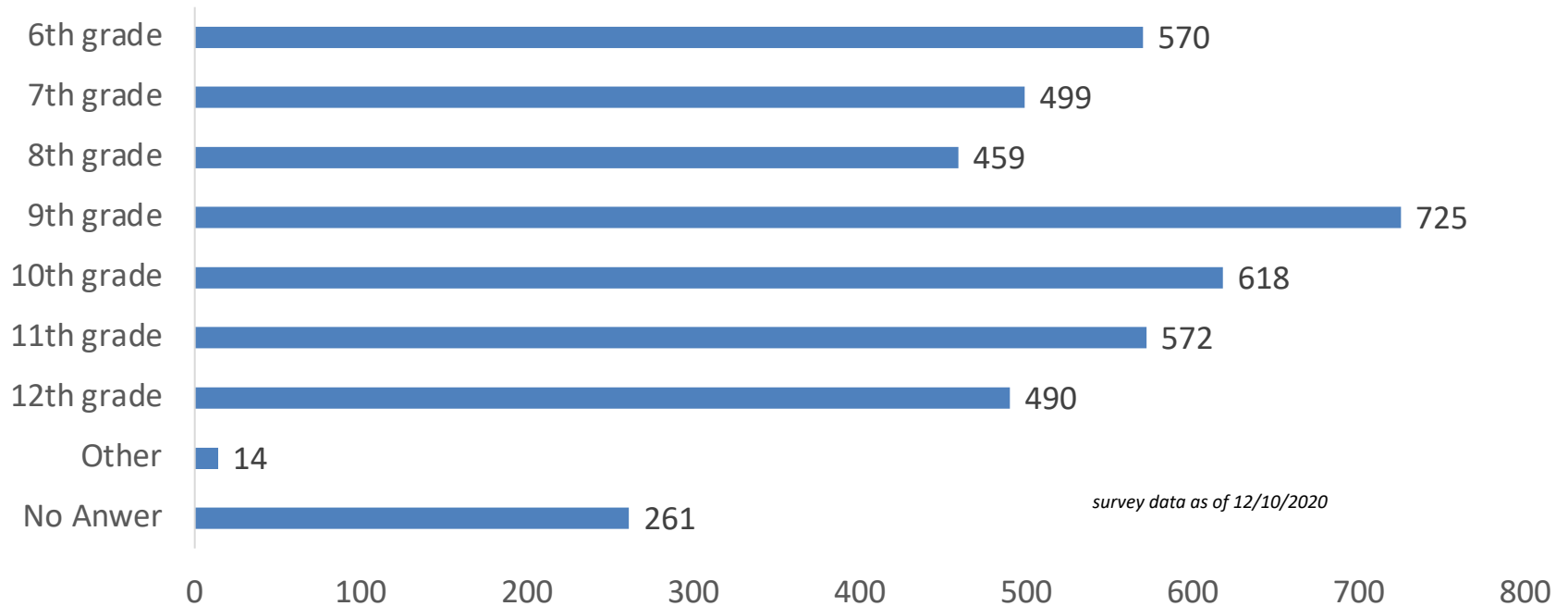

Responses by Ward

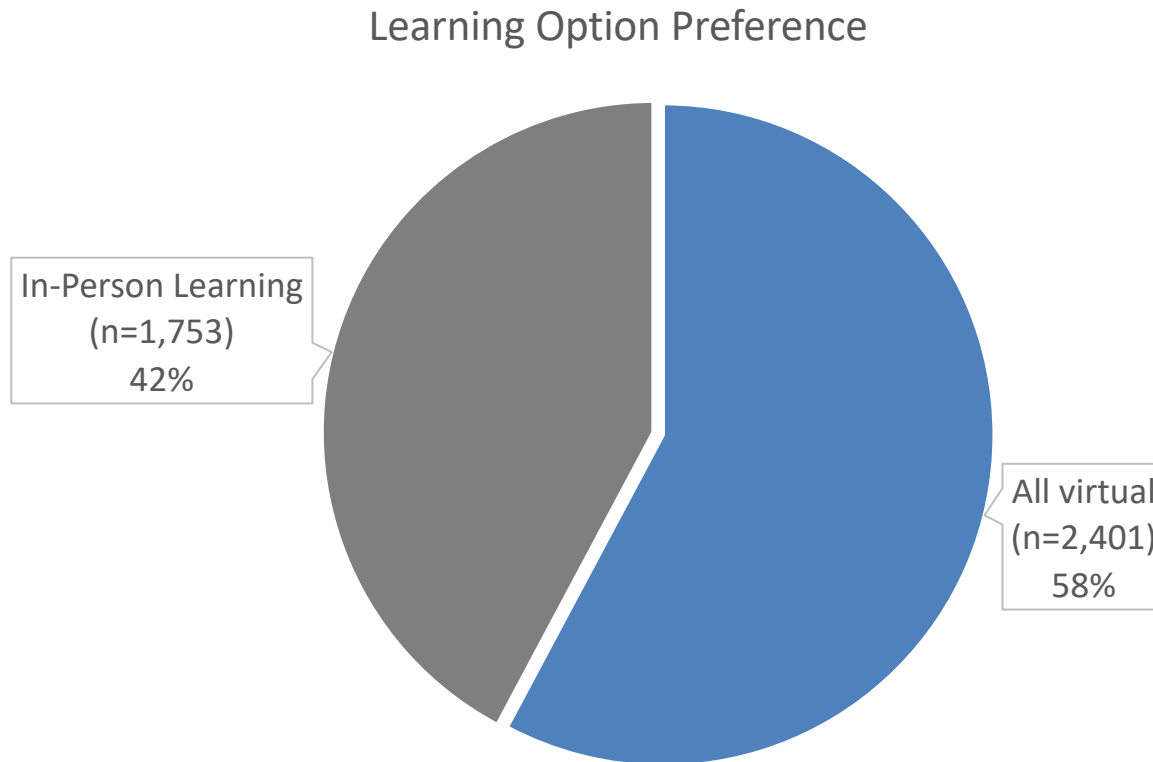


We heard from over 4,000 families/students across all 6-12 Grades

Over half of families/students preferred an all-virtual option

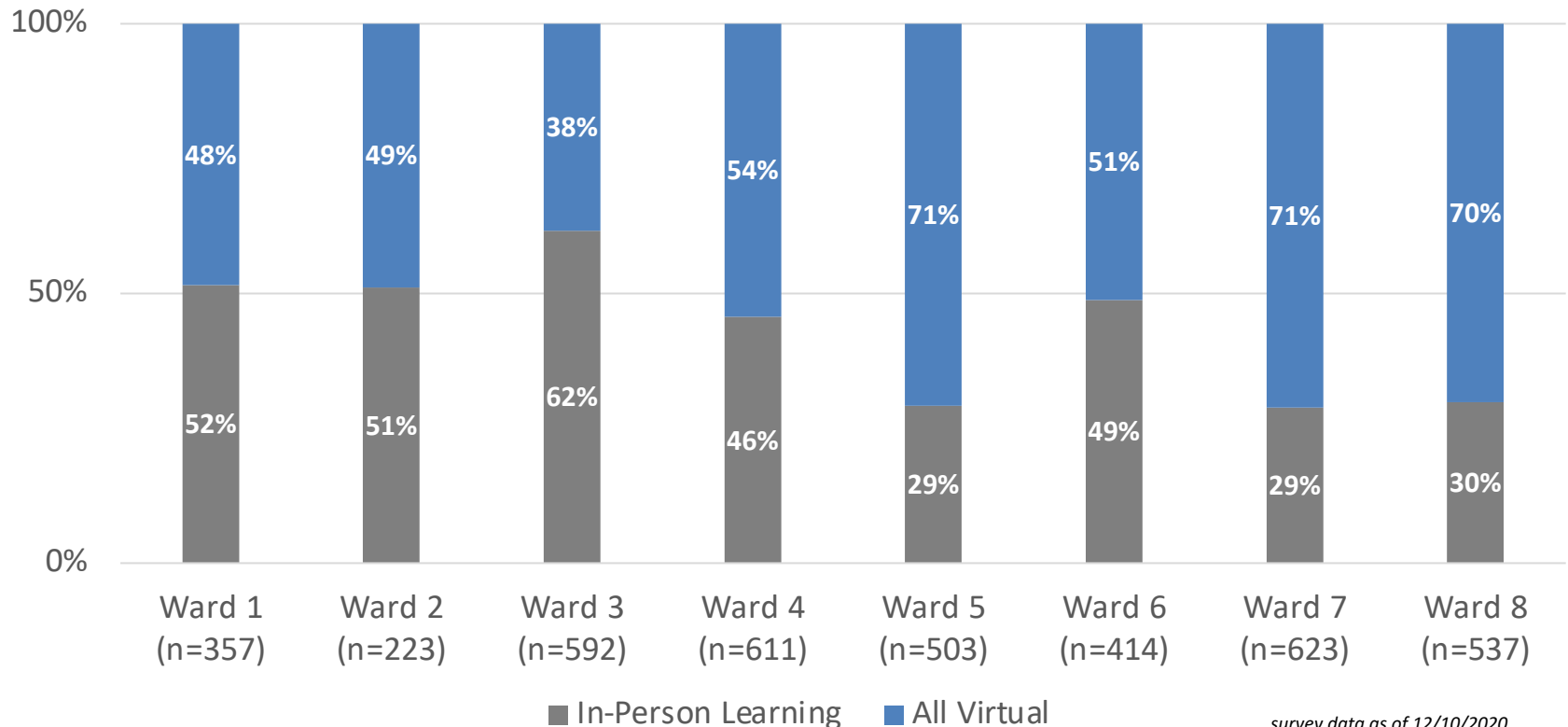

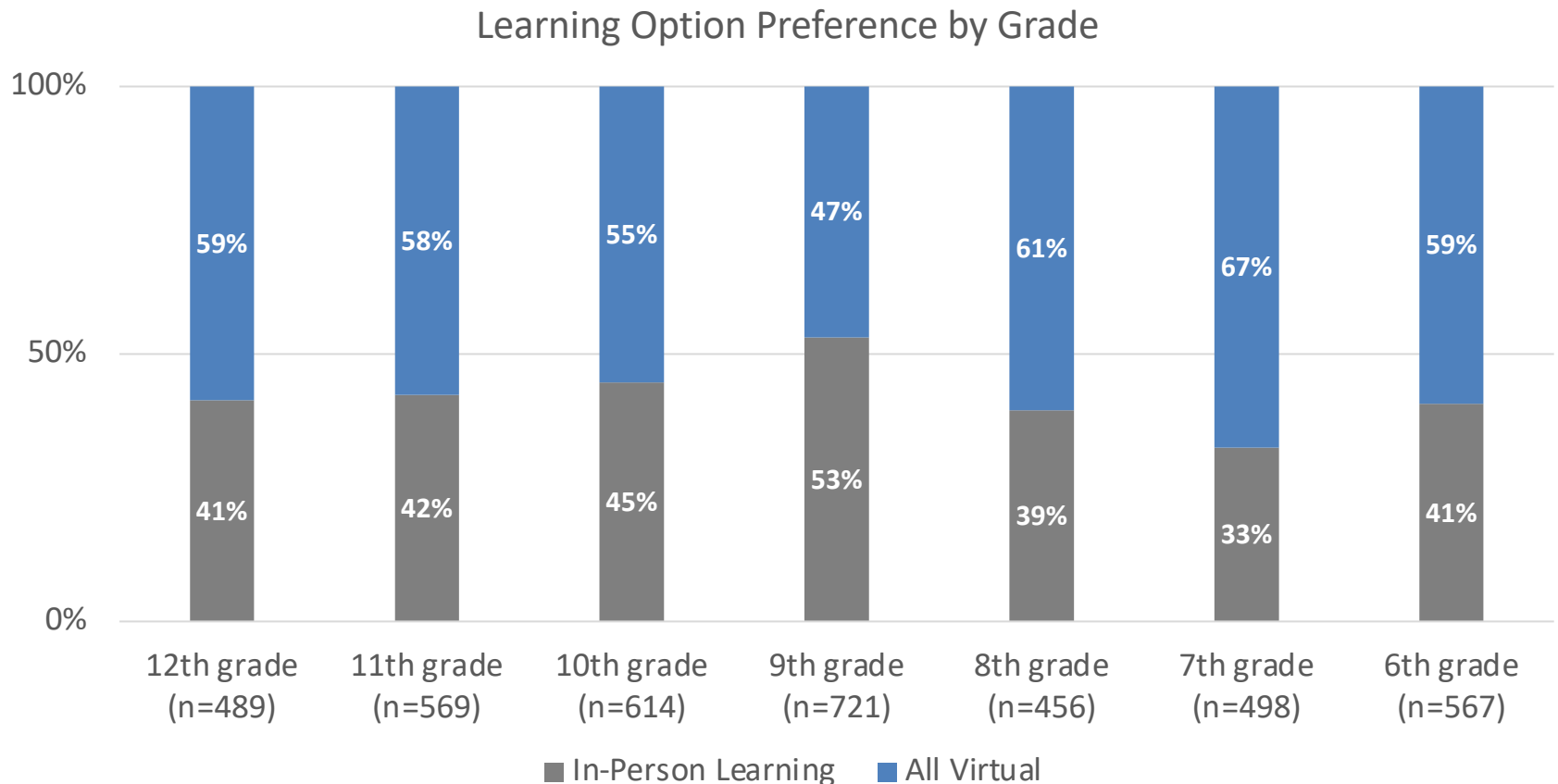
