



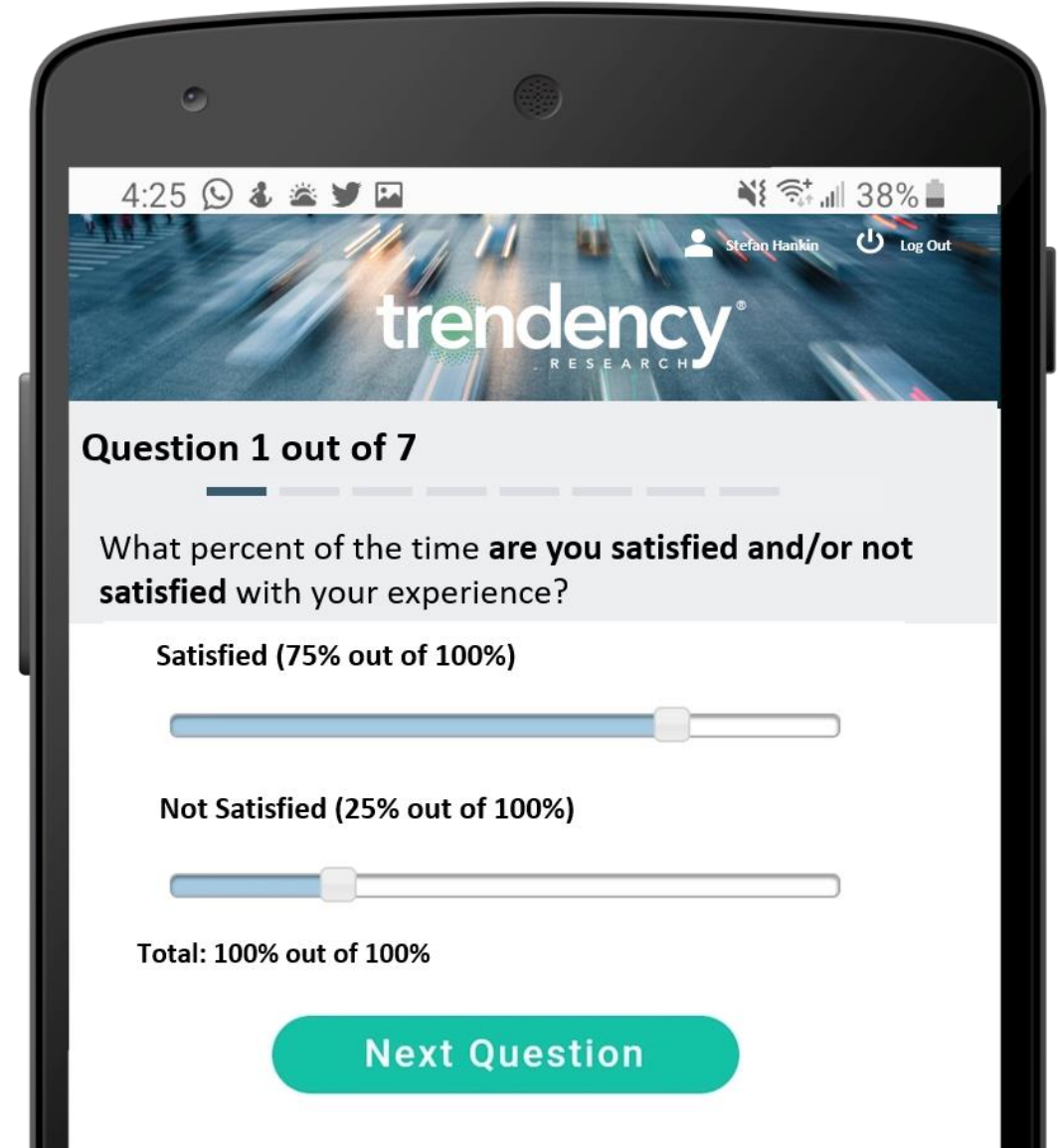

Quick Definitions: Allocations

Non-Binary Questions: Many Trendency questions are asked in a non-binary fashion, which means that respondents allocate their answers on a scale (typically 0-100) for each possible position. For example, when asked how satisfied they are, a respondent might answer 75% satisfied and 25% not satisfied vs somewhat satisfied in a typical 4 or 5 point scale.

Average: These values represent the average answer by respondents for that answer options. For example, 75% satisfied and 25% not satisfied means that, on average, respondents gave an answer of 75% to the satisfaction response, not that 75% of respondents are satisfied.



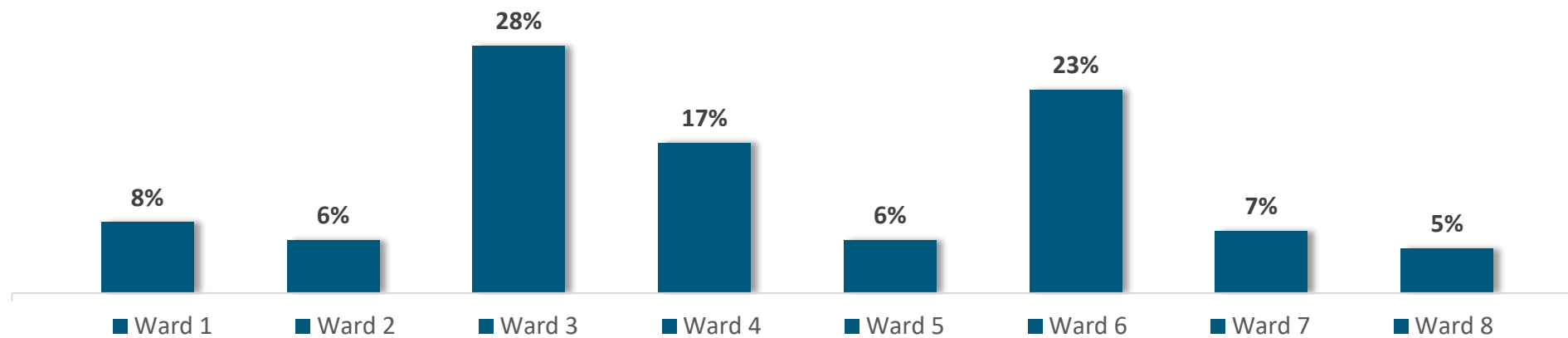

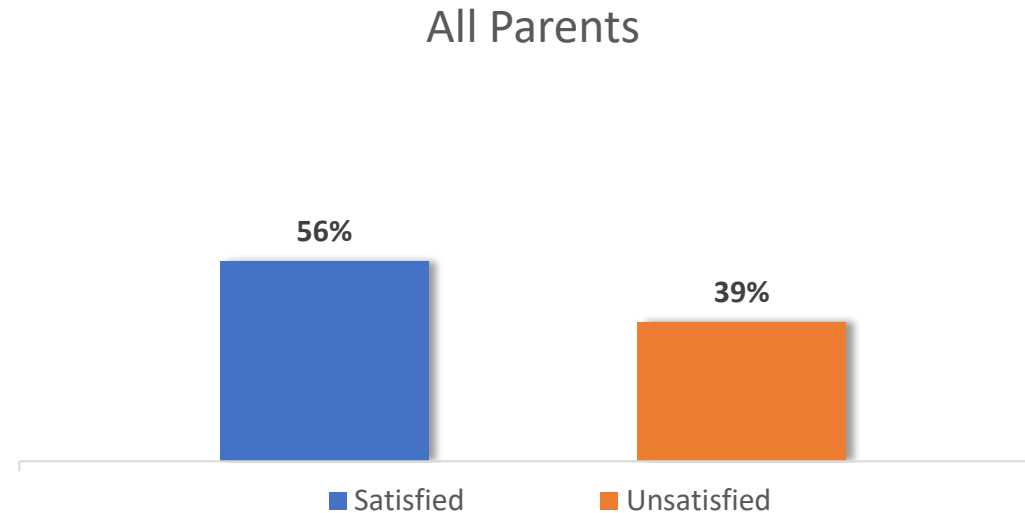
Ward by Percent

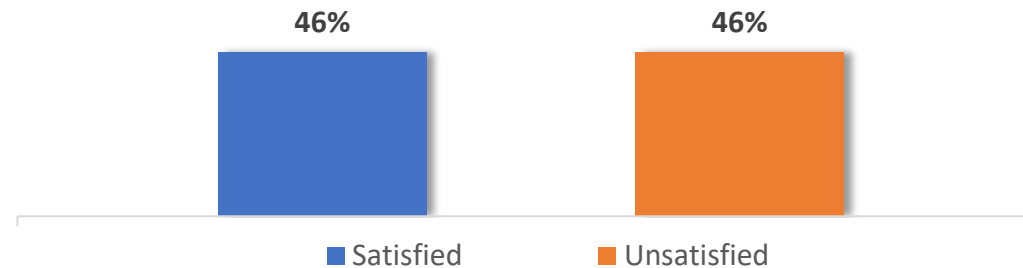

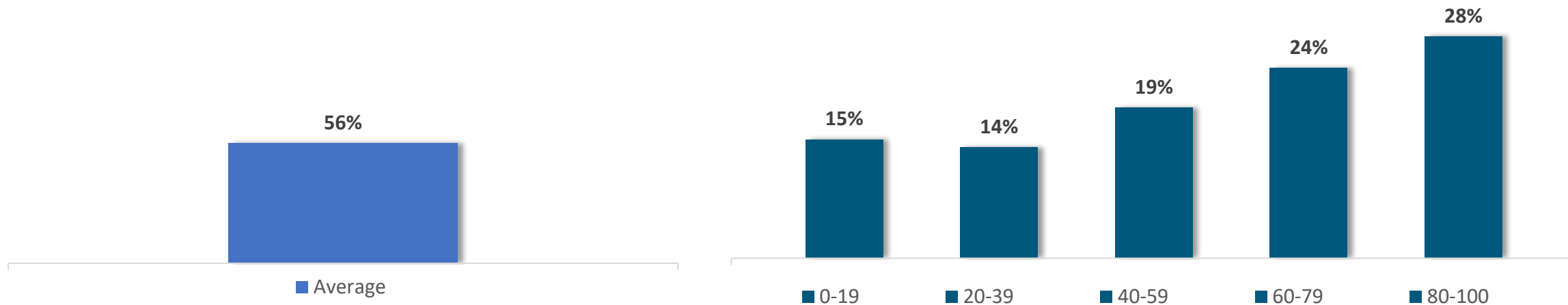

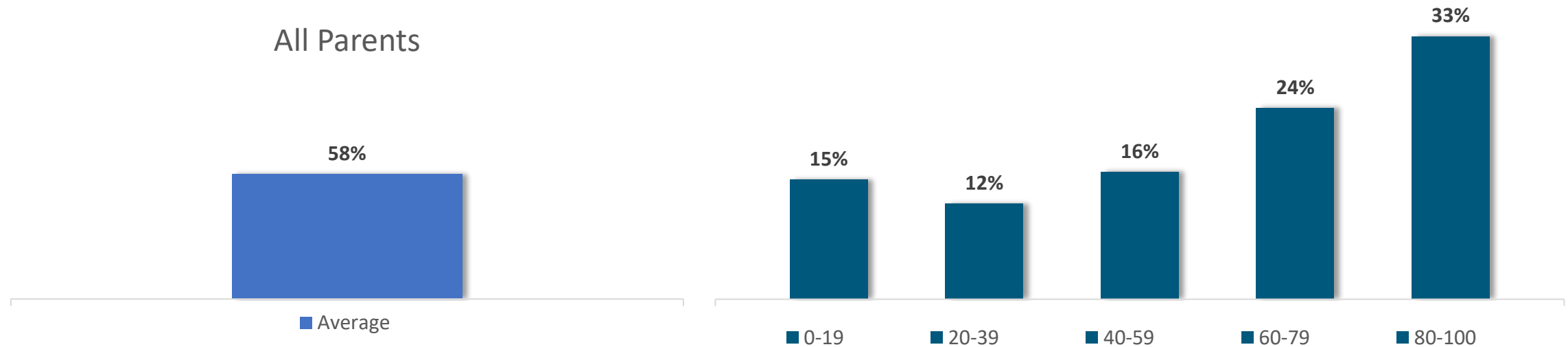

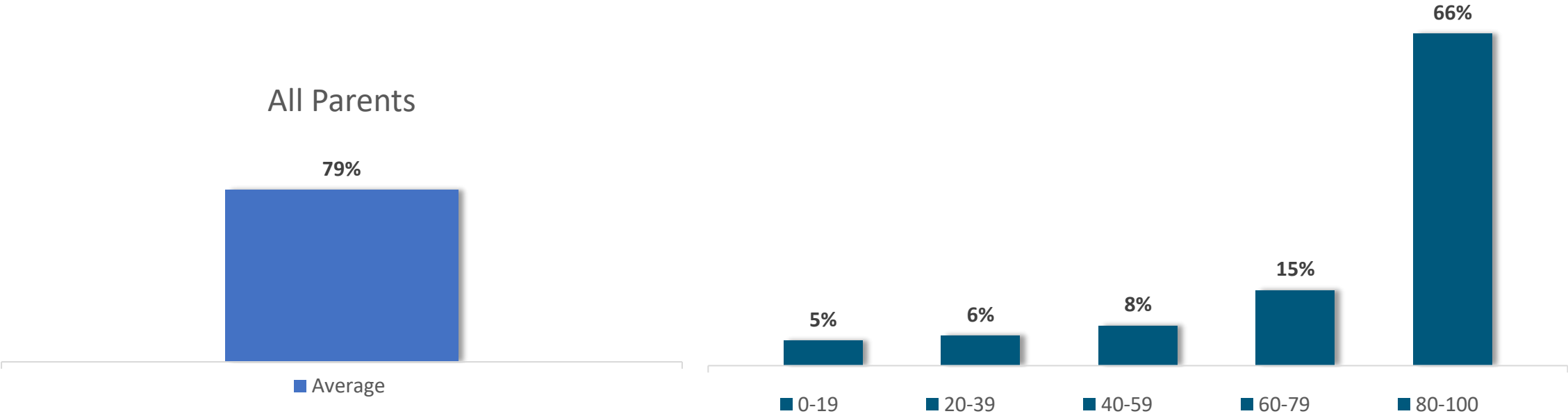

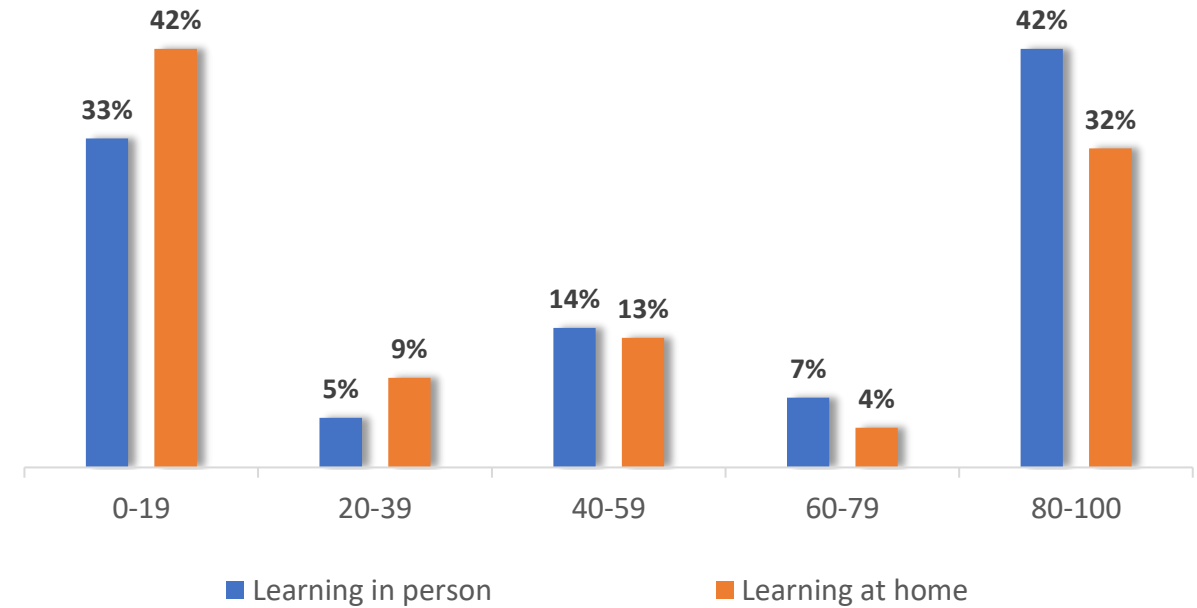
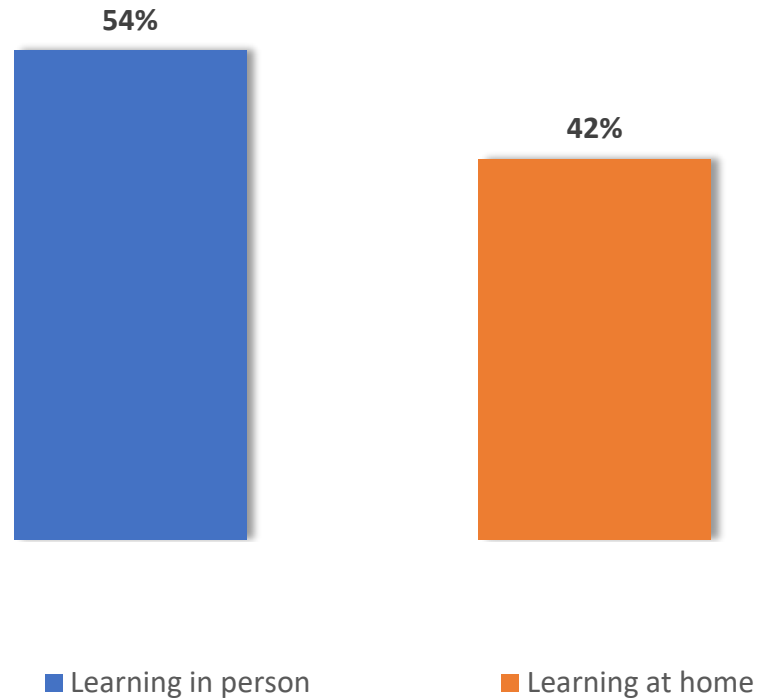

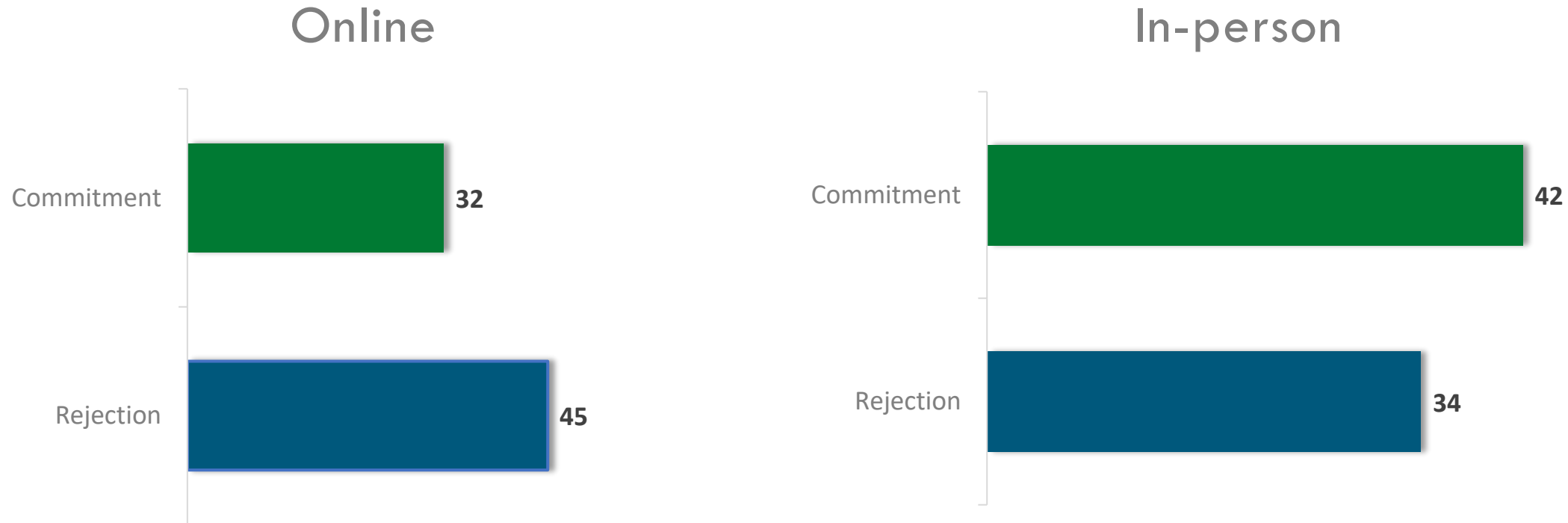

Note: The commitment index shows the percent of parents who are strongly committed to that answer option, while the rejection index shows the percent of parents who will never be expected to support that answer option.

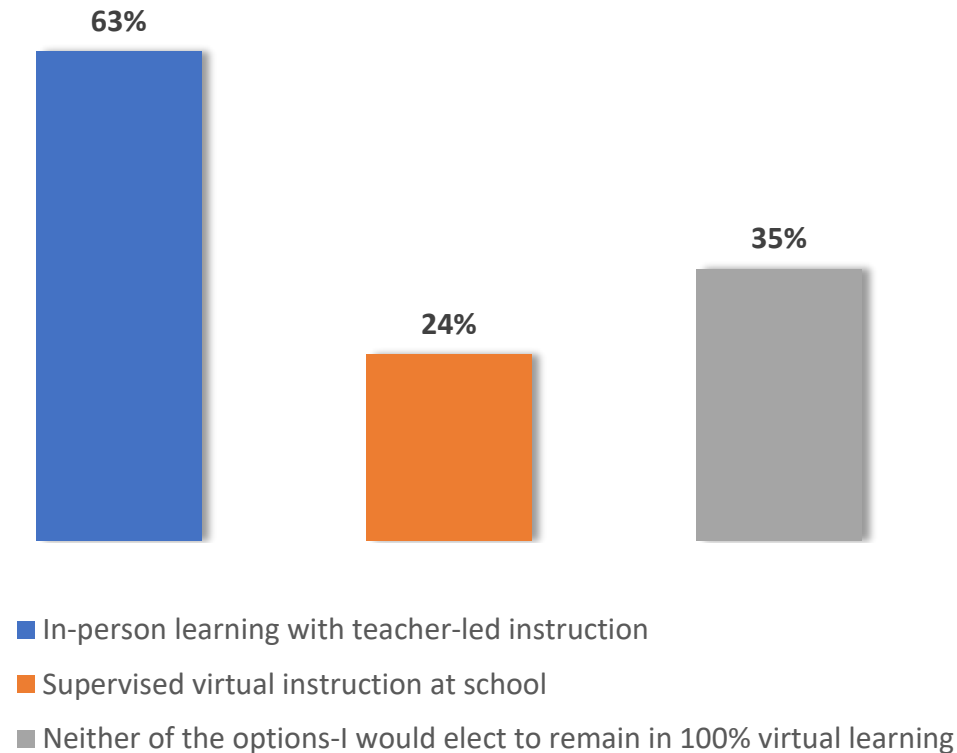
Learning Model Choice

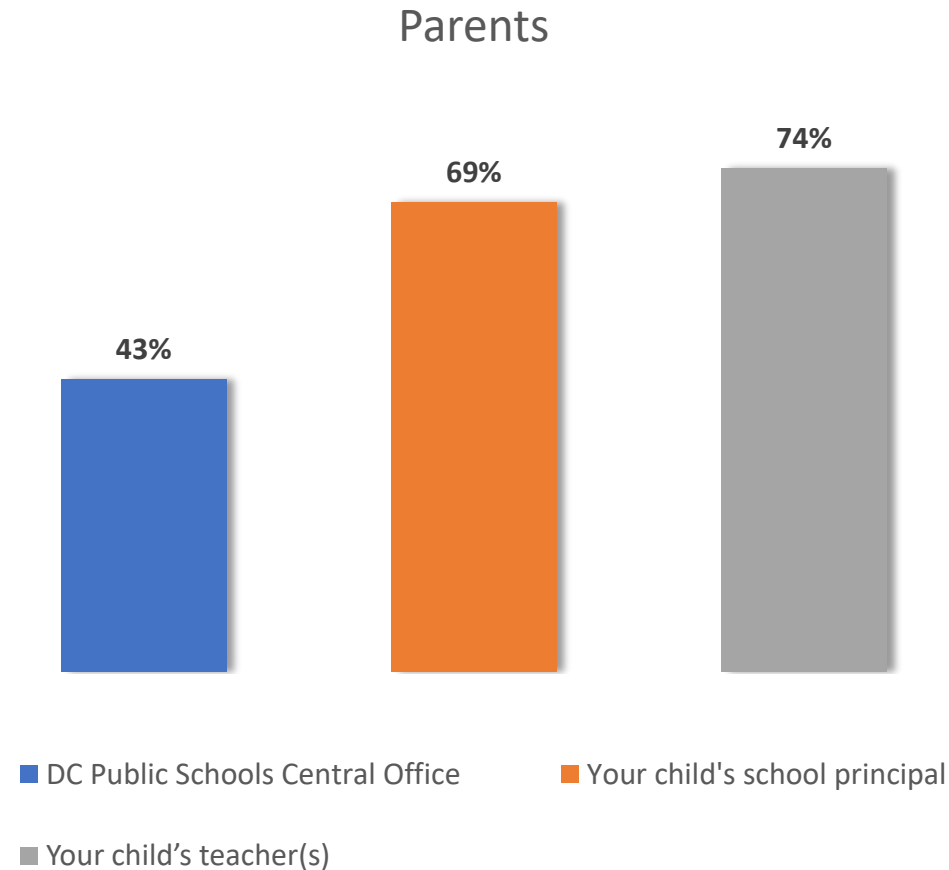

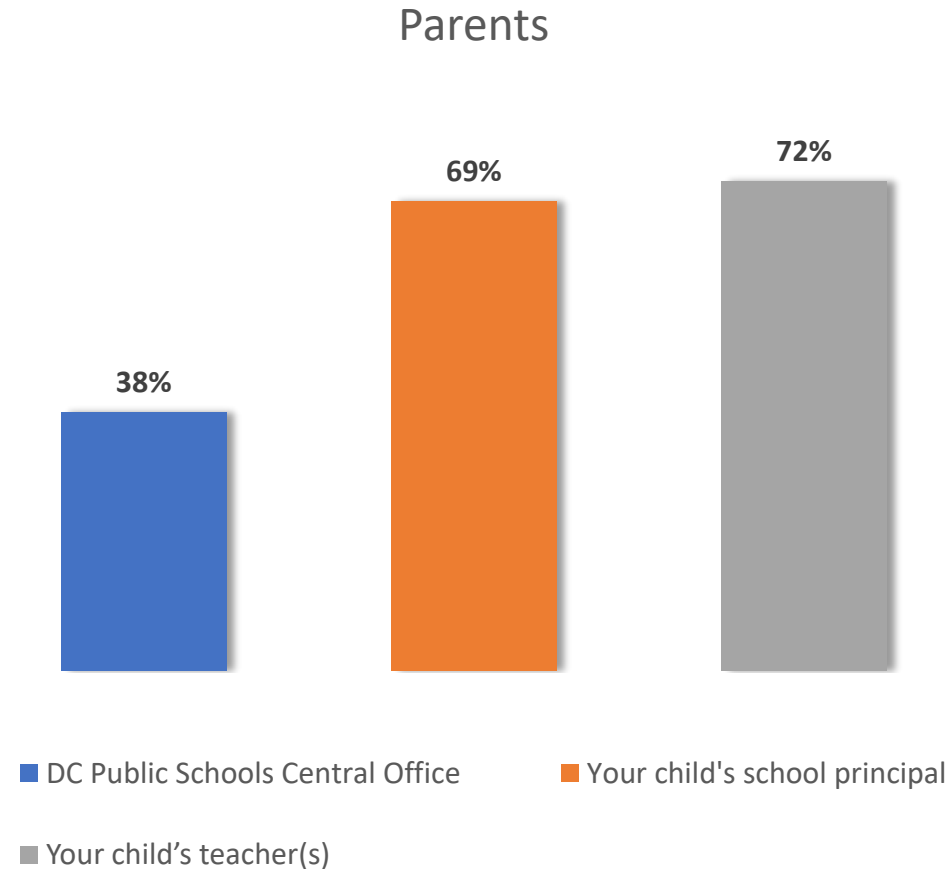

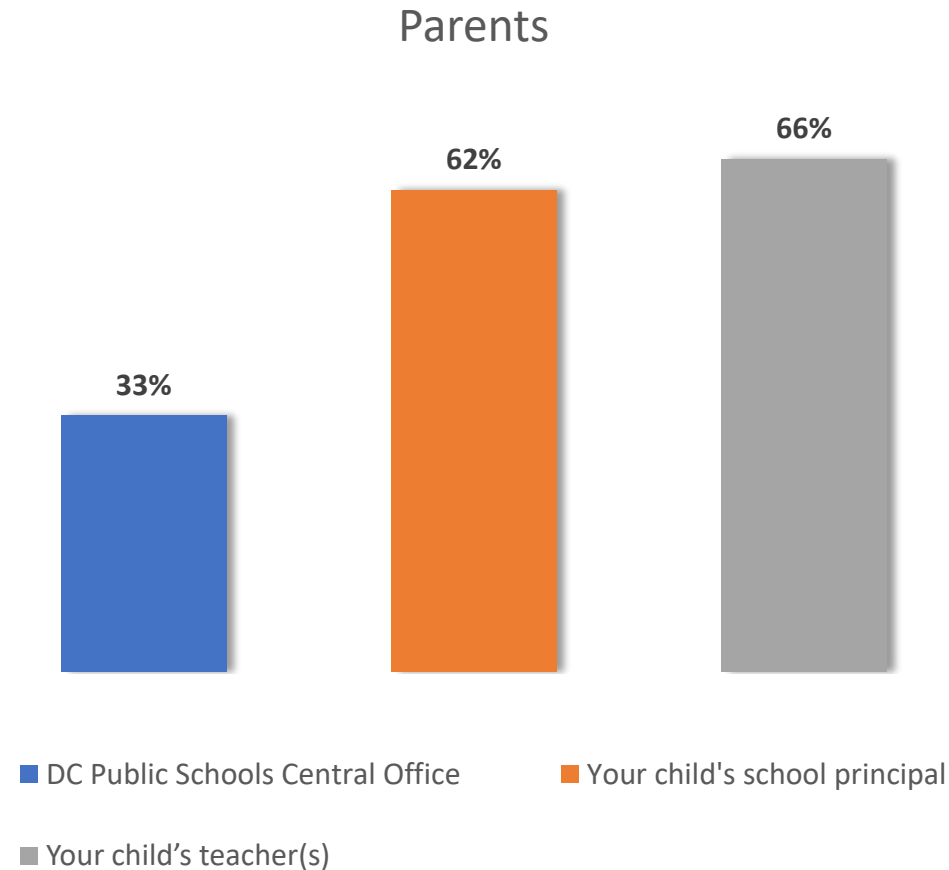

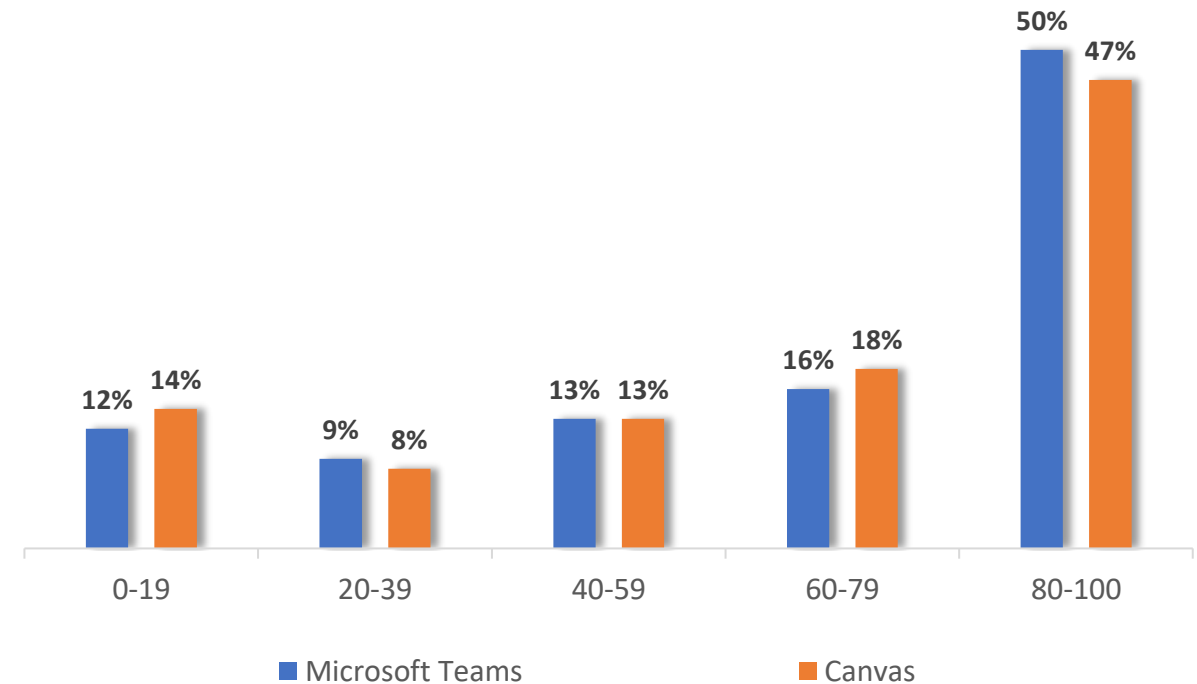

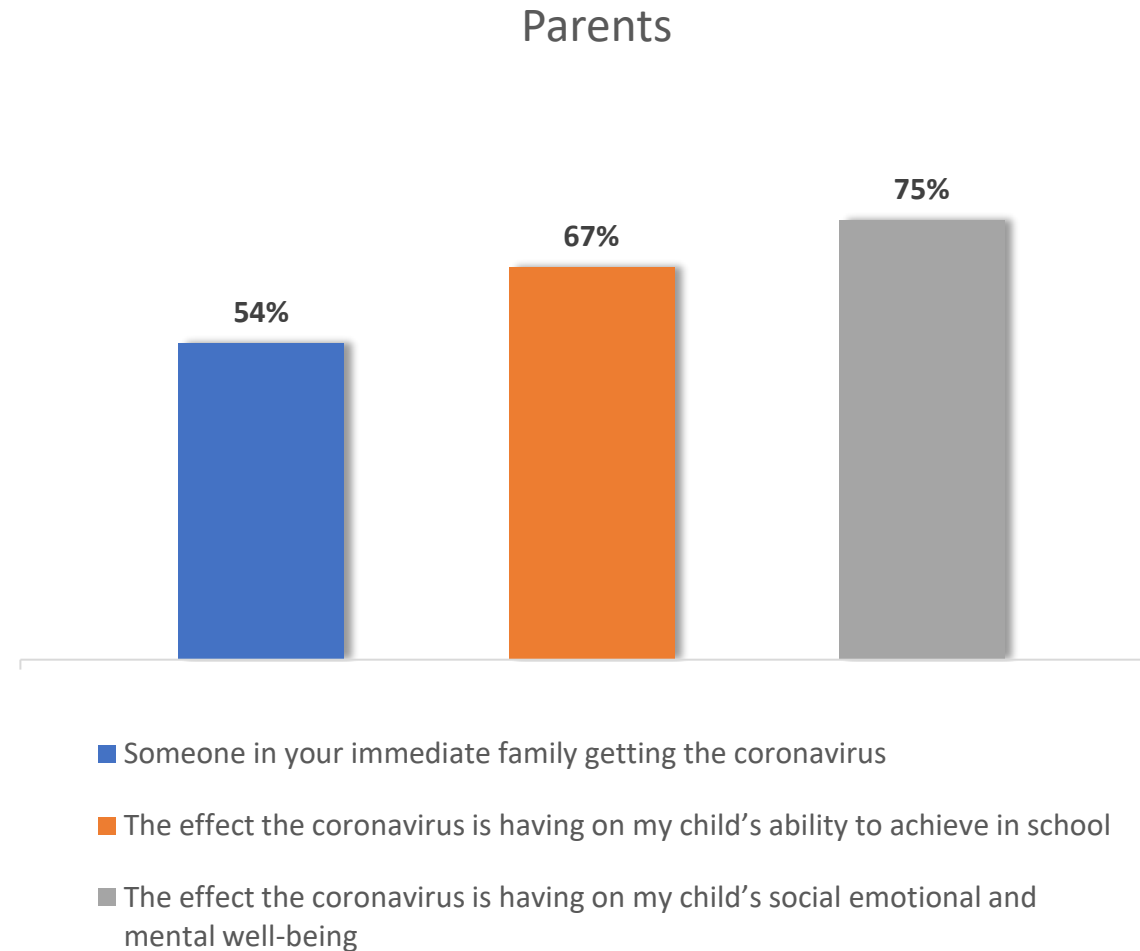

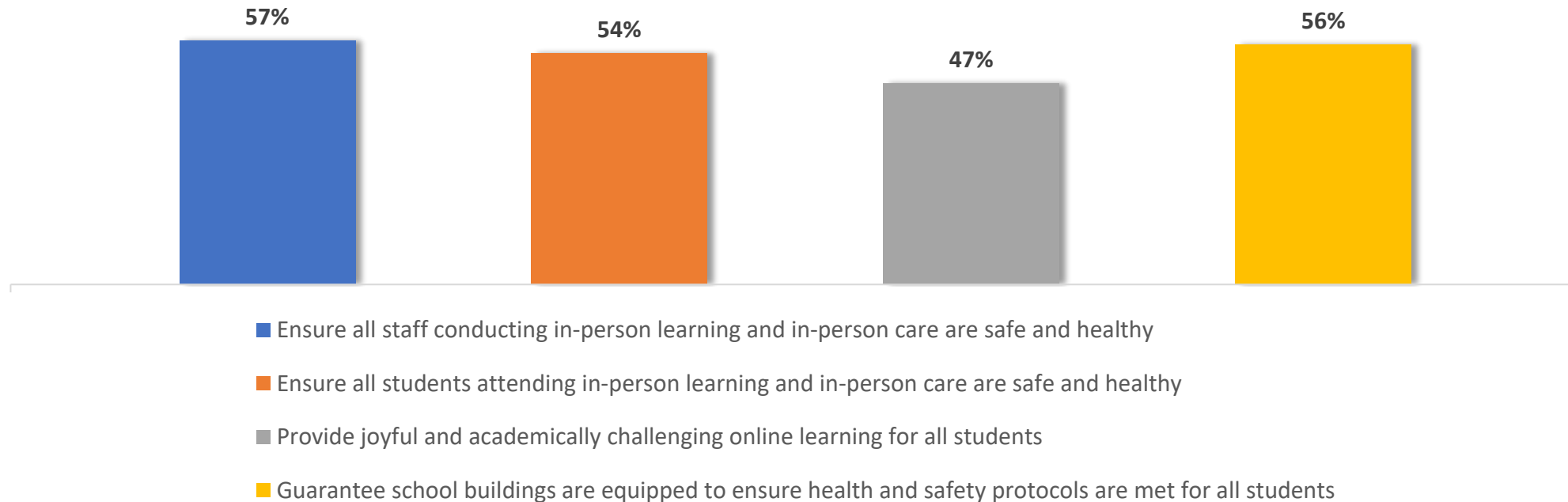
