





HEALTH AND SAFETY MEASURES FOR SY21-22



We Continue to Prioritize Health and Safety Preparations

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) & Hygiene Supplies

General PPE supplies, like face masks, will be provided for students and staff. Additional PPE supplies will also be available for staff who are in closer interaction with students and staff. Hand sanitizer and disinfectant will be provided to all schools.

Cleaning Supplies & Procedures

Schools will receive deep cleaning prior to the start of the school year. Schools will continue to receive daily enhanced cleaning and, also, deep cleaning per DC Health guidelines.

Classroom Set-Up

Classrooms and supporting spaces will be set-up to encourage social distancing as much as possible and to have desks and tables face the same direction as feasible.

Signage

Signage will be posted in arrival spaces and hallways to encourage hygienic practices.

HVAC Enhancements

We remain committed to maintain high air quality; systems will continue to allow for well-ventilated spaces at every school, including state-of-the-art HEPA filters in classrooms and air quality sensors throughout the building.

Water Access

Fountain spouts will continue to be turned off; alternate water sources will be available for staff and students (water bottles, water coolers, etc.)


Plumbing Systems











5 Days a Week for All Students



Five days a week of in-person instruction will focus on **meeting students where they are**, **prioritizing content** and **accelerating learning** by **going deeper**, not faster!

Guiding Principles for Acceleration



School Year Acceleration Academy (SYAA)

Strategically utilize time outside of the school day to strengthen student skills and provide access to grade level learning.

Who	10-35% of students, based on holistic data
What	Small group instruction and/or High Impact Tutoring (HIT) Supports both academics and social/emotional development
When	Outside of traditional school day, for approximately 8 hours per month Before school, after school, Saturdays, vacation days Begin week of September 13 (or sooner)
Success	Measure student progress on 6-8 week cycles

High Impact Tutoring

High-dosage tutoring is a proven, effective strategy for increasing student outcomes, with a strong research base (Fryer, 2016)

Who	5-10% of students
What	~30 minute sessions, 3 times per week, maximum ratio of 1:3 Consistent adult/student relationships
When	During or outside of the school day Start the week of September 13
Success	Progress monitored every 6-8 weeks

Efficient and Effective Technology Integration For SY21-22

- 1:1 device to student ratio in Grades 3-12 and 3:1 in PreK-2
- Expectation of some technology use most days in Grades 3-12 to support deep, holistic learning of grade-level content.
- Leverage common Tech tools to enhance learning: Canvas, Teams, PlayPosit, Smart/NearPod, Office 365
- Technology learning resources aligned to our acceleration strategy to provide additional supports
- Ongoing professional development and increased IT supports

Virtual Learning Options



DCPS Virtual Learning at a Glance

- Available for students in grades PK-12 with a documented medical need.
- Your child's health provider must complete and sign the COVID-19 Medical Consent and Certification for Distance Learning form for each student who needs virtual learning.
- Enroll in your school for SY21-22, then upload the form online or drop off at your school by July 6.

 We hope and expect the overwhelming majority of DCPS students will return to fulltime in-person learning next school year.

- However, we know there are a limited number of students who have a documented medical need that will require a virtual learning option for next year.
- To support these students DCPS will offer virtual instruction for a limited number of students who meet medical eligibility requirements.
- Virtual instruction based on medical need will be available across all grades from PK-12.

Health Precautions and Measures

COVID Screening	 -Performed by Patient Care Technician (PCT) at Entry. -If the screening is not cleared by PCT entry into the building will not be permitted.
Mask Required	-At all times while inside the building for student, staff, visitors except when eating or drinking.
COVID Testing Options	-Asymptomatic Testing will be provided. -Symptomatic Testing will be provided.
Health Isolation Rooms	 -Room designated in the school (preferably close to an exit) which will house ill students until Parent/Guardian arrives for pick up. -Monitored by Patient Care Technician (PCT.)
Reporting and Communicating	 -Incident Reporting Tool (IRT) is to be completed immediately for any suspected/confirmed cases.

Health Precautions and Measures

Quarantine Requirements: Travel

Domestic Travel:	International Travel:	Previously Tested Positive (90 Days)
 May not attend school for 10 days after returning, OR May not attend school until tested for COVID-19 three to five days after returning AND receive a negative COVID-19 viral test. 	 May not attend school for 10 days after returning, OR May not attend school for seven days after returning, get tested for COVID-19 three to five days after returning, AND receive a negative COVID-19 viral test. Even if the test is negative, the individual must still not attend school for seven days. 	 Provided that they do not currently have any symptoms consistent with COVID-19, an individual who has tested positive for COVID- 19 within the last 90 days or is fully vaccinated may be admitted immediately after domestic or international travel.

Unvaccinated or partially vaccinated individuals who have traveled to any place other than Maryland or Virginia


Ensuring Social Emotional and Mental Health is Prioritized

Vaccines are the best protection against vaccine-preventable diseases.

All DC students must have their immunizations **up-to-date before the next school year begins**. The COVID-19 vaccine is also available for eligible age groups.

- It's important to noteimmunizations are required for in-person attendance.
- Ensuring your child receives the right vaccinations at the right age is one of the most important ways to help them stay healthy and keep serious diseases at a distance.
- Students without immunization documentation will not be admitted.

How do I get AirPods or a \$51 gift card today?

You must get your first shot at one of three Youth Vaccine Giveaway Sites - Johnson, Sousa, or Brookland. You must choose either AirPods (as supplies last) OR a gift card.

For students:



- This must be your FIRST COVID-19 SHOT.
- You must have a parent or legal guardian with you.
- You must bring your school ID, DC One Card, Kids Ride Free card, report card, or proof of enrollment.

For parents/guardians:

One parent/guardian per student gets one gift card per child receiving their first COVID-19 shot at a Youth Vaccine Giveaway Site.

*Students ages 18-21 who are currently enrolled in a DC school seeking a high school diploma can receive a gift card or AirPods (if available).

DC HEALTH TRICT OF COLUMBIA

- The science is clear: vaccines are the single most effective tool we have to stop the spread of the coronavirus, and we are strongly encouraging all of our teachers, staff, students, families, and community members to get vaccinated.
- In partnership with DC Health and local health providers, any District resident age 12 or older can receive a COVID-19 vaccine at school locations. A parent or guardian must be present and sign a consent form for students who are 12 to 17 years old.


