### COVID-19 Response Protocol – At a Glance

### **HOW COVID-19 CASES AT SCHOOL ARE REPORTED**

#### **REPORT & ISOLATE**

**STUDENT** shares with their school they tested positive for COVID-19 after not feeling well and for showing symptoms common with the virus.

Student should isolate for at least 10 days and cannot attend school in person until medically cleared.

TEACHER or STAFF shares with their school they tested positive for COVID-19 after not feeling well and / or showing symptoms common with the virus.

Person will isolate for at least 10 days and not return to work until medically cleared.

ASYMPTOMATIC student, teacher or staff receives a positive result from weekly testing that screens for COVID-19.

Individual will isolate for at least 10 days and not return to school / work until medically cleared.

#### INVESTIGATE


- The person who tested positive for COVID-19 will be contacted to inform the school investigation.
- The DCPS COVID response team works with trained school staff to determine who is a close contact.
- · DC Health reviews the determination of close contacts for each school case and will make any needed updates or revisions.
- Students in a classroom setting who are within 3 to 6 feet of another student for longer than 15 minutes if both students are consistently wearing well-fitting masks and other mitigating factors are in place, such as increased ventilation.

#### **NOTIFY & QUARATINE**

- Using guidance provided by the DCPS COVID response team, school principals provide official instructions to quarantine for school close contacts.
- Fully vaccinated students or staff who are close contacts do not need to quarantine if they are not showing symptoms.
- Unvaccinated close contacts will receive instructions to quarantine for 10 days.
- Principals will send a notice to all students, families, and staff that a positive case was reported on a particular date at their school.
- · Community notices of reported cases are posted online at dcpsreopenstrong.com and if the individual was in a classroom, that class will be notified.

### School-based COVID-19 Testing Program

- ➤ The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends offering asymptomatic coronavirus (COVID-19) testing in schools.
- > COVID-19 testing helps schools to identify cases of COVID-19 quickly and reduce the risk of COVID-19 infections at school.
- All DCPS students are automatically eligible for symptomatic and random asymptomatic testing as part of the centralized school-based COVID-19 testing program with Shield T3.
- > Consent for student COVID-19 testing will take place via an "opt-out" process.
- ➤ Parents, guardians, and students age 18 and older can revoke consent through the opt-out form at any time. The form allows for electronic signature so parents and guardians and/or students 18 and older can email the form to their school. You can find the form under COVID Guidance and Resources on OSSE.DC.Gov.

### What is the COVID-19 Test?



- > This program uses a saliva-based PCR test
- ➤ The test is non-invasive and does not require medical personnel to collect the sample.
- ➤ The saliva sample is collected in a small test tube. A sample of 1-1.5 milliliters of saliva is collected.

### What Does Screening Testing Looks Like at School?



Once per week, each
DCPS school
participates in COVID19 screening testing.
This program is
managed by Shield
T3 via OSSE.



The goal is for each school to test at a minimum of 10% of enrolled students weekly. Students are selected at random to get tested.





Tests are processed by the testing lab, results are shared with families and DCPS Covid Response Team, school notifies positive individual and close contacts about how to quarantine and issues community notice.

### What kind of COVID-19 testing programs are done at school for students?

There are two kinds of testing options currently available in DCPS schools.

- 1. Symptomatic Testing: If a child is showing symptoms of COVID-19, they will be escorted to the Health Isolation Room for an assessment by a health professional and administered an on-site COVID-19 test, if appropriate.
- **2. Asymptomatic Testing**: Each week, DCPS randomly tests 10-20 percent of our students, who are not showing any COVID-like symptoms, as a surveillance measure.

All DCPS school-based testing is provided at no cost.



## How and when will I find out about the results of the test?

- Saliva test results will be available through a patient portal that is directly available to parents/guardians, or the adult student.
- Results are typically available in 6-12 hours.
- Parents/guardians, or the adult student, will also be contacted by the school if a test is positive.
- DC Health will follow up with parents/guardians, or the adult student, as part of their routine procedures for positive COVID-19 tests.



# What should I do if my student's COVID-19 test is positive?

- If the student's test results are positive, it means the student has the virus and could spread it. Please contact the student's healthcare provider immediately.
- The student should stay at home and follow the health and school guidelines from DC Health and from your school. If the student is on-campus when the test result is received, they will be taken to an isolation area until they can be picked up from school.
- As with any laboratory test, there is a small risk of inconclusive, false positive
  or false negative results. In the event of any concern regarding your health,
  including the presence of symptoms of COVID-19, you are strongly
  encouraged to contact your healthcare provider



# What should I do if my student's COVID-19 test is negative?

- If the student's test results are negative, it means that the virus was not detected in the student's specimen at this time. The student should continue maintaining the masking, hygiene and social distancing practices recommended by DC Health.
- If the student had a negative test result but is symptomatic or a close contact of an individual who tested positive for COVID-19, they should follow all guidance from DC Health and your school regarding when your student can return to school.
- If the student develops symptoms of COVID-19, you should call the student's healthcare provider, regardless of the test results.



### **COVID-19 Staff Testing in Schools**

- > DCPS offers both on-site asymptomatic and symptomatic COVID testing for school-based staff.
- > School-based staff who desire to participate in on-site COVID testing programs must opt-in.

### > Asymptomatic:

- ➤ DCPS staff who are unvaccinated may complete weekly asymptomatic testing at school and upload their results into DC's HR system. This satisfies the requirement under Mayor's Order 2021-109 for weekly testing for any unvaccinated DCPS staff member.
- ➤ Per Mayor's Order 2021-109, all DCPS staff working regularly in schools must complete a course of COVID-19 vaccine by Nov. 1, 2021. School-based staff with approved medical or religious exemptions would be able to access weekly asymptomatic testing under this program.

### > Symptomatic:

> Staff who opt in to the ShieldT3 testing program may also access on-site testing in the event that they develop symptoms of COVID-19 while at school.
