



DCPS COVID-19 Screening Expansion



Safe Return Testing for all students and staff before returning from February and April breaks















- 1. Safe Return Testing
- 2. Early Childhood Weekly Testing
- 3. Mail-Home Testing for Close Contacts
- 4. Routine Asymptomatic Testing

Safe Return Testing- Proof of a Negative Test is Required: Spring Break Update



Safe Return Testing for all students and staff before returning from February and April breaks

Maintaining the health, safety, and well-being of our staff, students, and families is our top priority. In collaboration with our health partners, it was determined that requiring 100% of students and staff to test prior to returning to school was a critical strategy to reducing the spread of COVID in our schools.





Test to Return Process Overview





Pick up a COVID-19 rapid antigen test at your school.

Tests will be distributed by Friday, April 8.

You can also pick up a rapid test at other public sites around the city.





Take the at-home test on Monday, April 18

Follow the instructions provided in your kit.







Upload proof of your negative test results to <u>dcpsreopenstrong.com</u> <u>lsafereturn</u> by Monday, April 18 at 9:00 pm.

Set a reminder on your calendar to complete this step!

Continue to monitor for any symptoms of COVID-19.

Get vaccinated.

Receive your booster.

Wear a mask.

Stay home if you are feeling sick.



What if my child tests positive?

- ✓ Please upload your positive results in the database and begin isolating immediately.
- ✓ All individuals regardless of vaccination status or recent COVID infections must isolate, if they test positive.
- ✓ There is **no option to reverse a positive test** result with additional testing.



When can my child return to school, if they test positive for COVID?



If you were initially asymptomatic and start to have symptoms, your isolation period starts over from the date of onset of symptoms.

School Health & Safety Updates

School Health & Safety Updates

effective March 16, 2022



Masks will be optional for students, staff, and visitors in DC Public Schools, DCPS offices, and on OSSE-DOT transportation. This policy will apply to all school-related activities. Students and staff are welcome to continue to wear a mask if they choose, and we will actively promote a climate where this choice is respected.



Our layered mitigation strategy remains in effect. Schools will continue enhanced air filtration efforts and cleaning protocols, symptom screening at the door, and our symptomatic and asymptomatic at-school testing program.



The isolation (should you test positive) and quarantine (should you be determined a close contact) time periods are now adjusted. For most scenarios, an individual can take a COVID test on day 5, and return to school on day 6 if they test negative and not have any symptoms.



We will continue to notify the community of positive reported cases at school and provide instructions to individuals identified as close contacts.



Getting the COVID-19 vaccine is best way to protect yourself and others. It is essential for our students to be fully up to date on their vaccines, including their booster shots, to protect themselves from COVID-19 AND to remain in the classroom if they are identified as a close contact of an individual with COVID-19.





Actualizaciones de salud y seguridad escolar

Efectivo el 16 de marzo de 2022



Las máscaras serán ahora opcionales para los estudiantes, el personal y los visitantes en las escuelas públicas de DC, las oficinas de DCPS y en el transporte de OSSE-DOT. Se aplica a todas las actividades relacionadas con la escuela. Todos nuestros alumnos y personal son bienvenidos a seguir usando una máscara si así lo desean, y promoveremos activamente un ambiente en el que se respete esta elección.



Nuestra estrategia de mitigación por niveles sigue vigente. Continuaremos con nuestros esfuerzos de filtración de aire y protocolos de limpieza mejorados, la detección de síntomas en la puerta y nuestro programa de pruebas sintomáticas y asintomáticas en la escuela.



Los periodos de aislamiento (en caso de que dé positivo) y de cuarentena (en caso de que se determine que es un contacto cercano) se han acortado. Para la mayoría de los escenarios, una persona puede hacerse una prueba de COVID el día 5 y regresar a la escuela el día 6 si da negativo y no tiene ningún síntoma.



Seguiremos notificando a la comunidad los casos positivos registrados en la escuela y dando instrucciones a las personas identificadas como contactos cercanos.



Vacunarse contra el COVID-19 es la mejor manera de protegerse a sí mismo y a los demás. Es esencial que nuestros estudiantes estén completamente al día con sus vacunas, incluyendo sus vacunas de refuerzo, para protegerse de COVID-19 Y para permanecer en el aula si son identificados como un contacto cercano de un individuo con COVID-19.

Enrollment Overview and Process

1. Know which school to enroll in.

- Identify your in-boundary or feeder school
- Re-enroll in your current DCPS school
- Review your lottery results

2. Gather necessary supporting documentation for upload as needed:

NEW to any DCPS school

- One proof of age examples include a birth certificate, hospital records, previous school records, passport, or baptismal certificate
- *Proof of DC residency* see the Residency Form(link is external) for a complete list of acceptable documents and verification method.
- Home language survey see Enrollment Form for this survey
- **RETURNING** to your current DCPS school
- Proof of DC residency see the Residency Form(link is external) for a complete list of acceptable documents and verification methods
- 3. Complete the SY21-22 electronic submission enrollment packet electronically or in-person at your school.
