School Without Walls Listening Session Summary

Session Overview:

On October 13, 2022, DCPS leadership met with students at School Without Walls. As part of the event's agenda, attendees participated in a gallery walk and a small group feedback session. During these exercises, attendees were asked to share their feedback around four main topical questions:

- What does a welcoming and affirming school community look like for all students, families, and staff?
- What can we do to ensure equitable programming and policies across all of DCPS?
- What do our students need academically, socially, and emotionally to reach their full potential?
- What resources do our staff, families, and students need to ensure all students thrive?

Summary of Feedback:

What does a welcoming and affirming school community look like for all students, families, and staff?

- Prioritizing mental health of students
- Continue to build trust amongst students and staff
- Positive reinforcement and acknowledge effort and growth
- Respecting students' pronouns
- Removing the emphasis on grades and test scores
- More guidance counselors who understand what the student needs
- Catering and supporting all learning types

What can we do to ensure equitable programming and policies across all of DCPS?

- Offer college prep and readiness classes
- Equity around the dress code policy
- More options for clubs and sports
- Access to therapy in school
- Consistency with teachers' class policies
- Offer a platform for students to provide feedback
- Ensure teachers are equipped to handle the students' needs





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What do our students need academically, socially, and emotionally to reach their full potential?

- Difficult to manage course load with service requirements, extracurriculars, college prep, etc.
- Restructure the Senior Project requirement
- Provide more enrichment programs
- Create standardized resources across the District and for individual schools
- Motivate the students and create engaging opportunities for them to learn
- Restructure the 5-day school week

What resources do our staff, families, and students need to ensure all students thrive?

- More funding for sports and extracurriculars
- Allocating funding towards student resources (calculators, textbooks, dances, etc.)
- Provide more transportation options for students
- Offer more AP classes across the District
- Create resources for student-athletes to start the college application process sooner
- Close the technical gap (more resources, faster Wi-Fi)
- Provide life skills classes (student loans, taxes, financial literacy)
